Ditch the dimes (and quarters)!

SMART CARDS are available for purchase in the Borough Office, 700 Sarah Street, Monday through Friday 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Meters that accept the Smart Cards are in the following locations: Lot No. 5, Lot No. 3, Ann Street, the 800 block of Monroe Street and the 700 block of Sarah Street.

There is an initial \$15 deposit for the card and any amount can be loaded (and reloaded) on to a card by cash or money



order. These cards are replacing the "Cash Key" system.

Any balance remaining on a Cash Key can be transferred to a Smart Card.

Web site upgraded


Stroudsburg has begun improvements to the Borough web site. The web address is new:

Stroudsburg Borough received a Commonwealth grant to aid low-income homeowners in *minor* rehabilitation of their homes located in Stroudsburg Borough <u>ONLY</u>. Eligibility for assistance is based on:

- Owner-occupancy;
- Household income (see chart below);
- Household owners that are 50 years of age or older; and
- Have a permanently, physically disabled household member.

A wide variety of work is eligible under the Program but is not limited to:

- Repairing major systems such as heating, electrical, plumbing, and roofing;
- Making the home more energy efficient;
- Structural components (walls, decks, and porches);
- Windows and doors; and
 Accessibility

Qualified applicants can receive aid for health and safety housing improvements. Eligible improvement requests may include roof replacement, foundation repairs, and electrical system safety upgrades.

Funding for this program is very limited and requests for assistance are accepted on a first-come/first-served basis.

Fences in Stroudsburg's Historic District


The Historic and Architectural Review Board considers fencing to be a major element in the character of Stroudsburg's Historic District because of its often strong visual impact and extension of the architecture of a building. An appropriate fence design can connect a building's architecture and landscape of a property while also creating property boundaries, protecting pets and children, and enhancing privacy.

Fences are not required to be historical re-creations, but when their scale, design, and materials harmonize with the size, style, and period of a house

they often look their best.



Wood and metal materials have been utilized for decades in the



construction of fences and are still today's choice materials because of their availability, ability of arrangement for design, and ease of construction.

Contact the codes office at the earliest part of planning your fence to discuss zoning requirements, permits, and design elements of your fence as approval is required prior to construction or alteration of a fence.

Help the Borough DPW help you!

Public works crews work hard all year to keep the Borough safe and tidy. Many operations rely on residents to follow rules which ensure worker safety and increase efficiency. Below are some seasonal items for which we need the cooperation of our residents and business owners...

- When sweeping/clearing/blowing sidewalks of trash, etc., do not have this debris wind up in the street. Street sweeping operations occur very early in the morning, so help is needed to ensure the streets adjacent to the sidewalks stay clean for the remainder of the day.
- For curbside brush pickup, <u>**DO NOT**</u> place brush in the street. This blocks drainage and can cause flooding when storm water inlets become blocked.

Instead, place brush at the edge of the yard adjacent to the street, also making sure not to block the sidewalk.

• The same rule applies when placing leaves curbside for collection.

Place <u>ONLY LEAVES</u> in piles to be collected and <u>DO NOT</u> mix in any other trash, debris or yard waste. Foreign materials mixed in with leaves causes hazards to public works crews and also can damage leaf collection equipment.

<u>Fall Curbside Brush Pickup</u> Tues., Wed. & Thurs.: September 22, 23 & 24 Tues., Thurs. & Fri.: November 10, 12 & 13

Leaf Collection begins Tues., October 13th and lasts for six weeks. Note Stroudsburg Borough does not have Spring leaf collection.
